Pentecost Sunday

The reading from Acts sets the tone for today's celebration. Luke tells how the Church's universal mission was inaugurated, in the power of the Holy Spirit, as faithful Jews gathered for their Pentecost festival, fifty days after the Passover celebration.

Luke was conscious of his task of telling the world what had really happened – as he makes clear in introducing

each of his two works. He faced a great challenge, however, as he set out to describe and interpret the vast complexity of the Church's early development. He met this difficulty by choosing several events that were turning points in the Church's history, and presenting them in a dramatic way that made clear their profound significance – a device used by other writers of the day.

Luke's story of the Church's first Pentecost is an example of this approach. The Church's first courageous witness, and its subsequent announcing of the Good New throughout the

known world, was a remarkable fulfilment of the Saviour's promise that he would give his disciples courage and power through the gift of his own Spirit (Mk 13:9-11). The universality of the Church's mission is made clear. The Church's first witness is to 'devout people from every nation' - in the first place to 'Jews', but with the mention of 'proselytes' among the crowd addressed the conversion of the gentiles is also anticipated. In the continuation of our passage, Peter's sermon gives a summary of the Church's early witness.

It is in the power of the Spirit that the Church takes up its mission. Today, before all days, the Church invites us to deepen our faith in the Saviour's gift of his own Spirit.



Already in the Old Testament, 'the Spirit of God' was active as a life-giving force at work in creation. Anointed by the Spirit as God's 'Servant', in fulfilment of the prophecies of the Book of Isaiah, Jesus has led us to know the Spirit as a Person sharing the one divine life with the Father and the Son. Today's gospel reading is a meditation upon this shared life, and the way in which

those who find faith in Christ are made to share in it. Those who have received the gift of the Spirit can tell the world the 'complete truth' about the Saviour of the world, and can announce 'the things to come', because the mystery of God's final plan for the world has been revealed in the events which took place in Jerusalem at the time of the Passover.

The Spirit is the Spirit of Christ; the Spirit is the very life principle of the Church; the Spirit dwells in each believer as our 'paraclete' – the companion who stands by us in all our trials, providing whatever is needed to survive every


trial. We live 'in Christ' because he has given us his own Spirit. Paul's letter to the Galatians contrasts the ugly manifestations of a selfish abuse of our freedom with the 'fruits of the Spirit' which are to be seen in the lives of those who chose to 'belong to Christ Jesus': 'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, truthfulness, gentleness and self-control'. In these things, the Spirit gives us an intimation of 'the things to come', the fullness of God's Kingdom.

From Today's Reading

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11. Pentecost originally was a Jewish feast that occurred 50 days after the Passover celebration and commemorated the giving of the law to Moses on Mt. Sinai, along with offering the first fruits of the spring harvest to the Lord. On the Pentecost following Jesus' resurrection and ascension, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and those gathered with them, bringing fulfillment to this feast by bringing the new law in the Spirit, which is written on our hearts. The descent of the Holy Spirit is depicted using Old Testament imagery. The "strong driving wind" and "tongues as of fire" are reminiscent of the encounters with God on Mt. Sinai by Moses (see Exodus 19) and Elijah (see 1 Kings 19). The presence of the Holy Spirit manifested itself miraculously through "different tongues." As the context reveals, this indicates that the Apostles were supernaturally able to speak in many languages and be understood by the diverse crowd. This evidences the Holy Spirit's role in bringing unity to the people of God. Sin separates but the Spirit unites. The fact that the diverse crowd, representing many nations and languages, could understand each other served as a reversal of what happened at the Tower of Babel back in Genesis



11. At that time, due to sin, people were separated by various languages. At Pentecost, due to grace and the power of the Holy Spirit, people who would have been separated by language and nationality were brought together. This unity is a characteristic of the Church. Pentecost traditionally marks the beginning of the Church and reminds us that the Church is meant for all peoples. In fact, the word "Catholic" means "universal," indicating that it crosses societal, ethnic, and linguistic barriers. In the Church, we all speak the same "language" because we profess the same faith, despite our many differences.

EXCERPT FROM THE AMBO ANNOUNCEMENT FROM DAVID CARVELL (Finance Council Chairperson), May 12, 2024

I have two very enjoyable tasks to perform this morning. As most of you know we had a very successful Philippine Madrigal Singers concert on May 2/24. We reported approximately \$11K as the amount that will go to our Raise the Roof Campaign. All of this would not have been possible without the drive and great work from Murray Knoll & Melinda Toth as well as our parish team. In particular, Fr. Wilfred was a dynamo on the sales front, and Sr. Aime was responsible for all the administrative duties and making sure the financials all added up properly at the end of the event. For their efforts, I would like to call Sr. Aime forward to receive a memory book from the Philippine Artist Circle. Most of the written articles are in Tagalog, so she will have to interpret for the rest of us to truly understand the dynamics of the pictures and artistic renderings. Please enjoy as a small token of the parishes good wishes and thank you's.

Next, I would ask Fr. Wilfred to come forward and receive two signed posters from the Madrigal Singers. He was instrumental in driving sales for the event, but also for hosting 4 of the Madz Group, and then driving them to Lumsden and Winnipeg in his spare time! They also found out that he was an excellent cook when he puts his mind to it. One of the posters is for your rectory and the other is for our parish once we get into the new nave. Again, many thanks from your parishioners!


Today, is also the beginning of what we have been waiting for over the past 15 months. I want to take this opportunity to announce that construction will begin in the Nave starting next week. We have signed contracts with Stantec and PCL to begin demolition of the ceiling and moving the pews to safe storage. Therefore, effective May 12/24 the upstairs foyer and meeting room will be closed to everyone other than construction personnel. You can gain access to the office, but only through the front doors from now until later this fall when the renovation is complete. Our Renovation Team is now finalizing initial drawings and identifying the aspects of the project. However, we have target dates of September 30, 2024 for the completion of the Nave Renovation and renovations to the foyer area. Keep praying that everything now remains on schedule.

We still have several things to finalize to complete the financing part of the renovation, and we hope that our meeting with the Archdiocese on May 28, 2024 will close the loop on the loan that we require.

In closing, I want to thank all the parishioners and others who have donated to our Raise the Roof Campaign. We still need you to keep on praying for the successful completion and we will be reporting back as we progress.

An internationally recognized program, CPE teaches skills and competencies for professional spiritual care and can lead to certification with Canadian Association of Spiritual Care (CASC/ ACSS). Students gather with a small peer group for a full day on Tuesdays and spiritual care clinical practice opportunities will take place one day per week at Santa Maria + students' current ministry sites. 
